Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

**Lord, Help Us Answer the
Cry of the Poor**

The first Reading and the Gospel on this last Sunday in September have as themes the complacent rich who pamper themselves at the expense of others and who have lost interest in the suffering of their fellow human beings. There comes a time when lost opportunities cannot be regained.

While he lived, the rich man knew full well that Lazarus and others like him could have eaten well from his table scraps. However, he chose to ignore the prophetic witness against the abuse and neglect of the poor. The rich man knew the good, but he chose the bad.

The catechism reads: "The drama of hunger in the world calls Christians who pray sincerely to exercise responsibility toward their brethren, both in their personal behavior and in their solidarity with the human family."

"Heavenly Father, look with love upon the poor and hurting in this world and in this community which we serve. Give us hearts of love and compassion to embrace those in need with your love and provision."

On September 27th, the Church commemorates the Feast of St. Vincent de Paul. In his early years, Vincent's ambitious plan involved entrance into the world of people with influence. Later, however, he emerged from a spirit of careerism and self-centeredness to rediscover the meaning of his existence and his priesthood. God's grace and his response to it gave him the courage and holiness to become an apostle for the well-being of the poor and the formation of the clergy.

As the hot and humid summer comes to a close (Praise the Lord!) , let's complete our summer project by finishing Lisa Genova's wonderful novel, Still Alice. Lisa provides for us a character, Alice Howland, who will remain in our psyche long after we finish the book. In a curious way, we suffer along with Alice and her family as she struggles with the disease of Alzheimer's. Indeed, Still Alice has the power to change lives - our lives.

Still Alice Project Reflection 4:
Why is her mother's butterfly necklace so important to Alice? Does Alice feel a connection to butterflies beyond the necklace?

On Sunday, October 2, we will watch the inspiring film version of Still Alice, starring Academy Award winning actress, Julianne Moore, in the title role. We will gather at the Burlington County Library Auditorium in Westampton. I will co-facilitate a panel discussion with Lee Gillis, CALA, the Executive Director of Brookdale Senior Living as we lead an open 'question/answer session' with: a family who has a member suffering with the disease; an Alzheimer patient and an elder care attorney. Our purpose will be to present not only a lively chat about Still Alice but to also offer valuable and practical information about Alzheimer's disease and dementia.

Mark it down on your calendar...October 2 (1:30pm). Usually, I say to enjoy your reading experience; however, with Still Alice, enjoying is not an appropriate word. My hope is that your reading of Still Alice will increase your understanding and awareness of Alzheimer's Disease. Look for updates on the Still Alice Project in future bulletins.

BIBLE STUDY

Our evening Bible Study facilitated by John Madden, M.A. in Theology and Ministry, will be exploring *The Other Gospels*, those non-canonical, or sometimes called apocryphal, writings that had so much influence on the traditions that emerged in the early Christian church.

We'll look at only a few of the hundreds of writings now in translation, including *The Gospel of Thomas*, *The Protoevangelium of James*, *The Infancy Gospel of Thomas*, *The Gospel of Peter*, *The Gospel of Thomas*, *The "Secret" Gospel of Mark* and others. We will discover the origin of St. Joseph's flowering staff, and will learn about Mary's parents and her early childhood, and how the Church utilized these non-canonical sources to expand its understanding of events and people not expressly discussed in the canonical gospels.

Unlike previous Bible Studies, however, we will not be using prepared materials from a program like Little Rock Scripture Study. Instead, participants will be directed to the website www.earlychristianwritings.com and asked to download the assigned gospels or other writings. The facilitator will also distribute via e-mail commentaries he has prepared as well as study questions to encourage classroom discussion. In the event one is not able to access a computer or for any other reason cannot download the various texts, the facilitator will make other arrangements to ensure that the participant obtains all of the materials needed.

Living the Good News Today

“Remember that you received what was good during your lifetime.”

On 2 August 2008, the great Franciscan feast of Our Lady of the Angels, Fr. José Rodríguez Carballo, OFM (Minister General) presented the friars a resource for ongoing formation to mark the eighth centenary of the foundation of the Franciscan Order. It was entitled “*Pilgrims and Strangers in This World.*” By focusing on Chapter IV of their General Constitutions, the friars were to reconnect with the basic themes of their spirituality: minority; promotion of justice and peace; care for creation; appropriation of nothing for oneself; life among the poor; and faithful and devout work.



Because our Secular Franciscan spiritual assistant referred to this resource in a reflection that he shared with us, I found the entire document on the OFM website to understand better why the words “pilgrim” and “stranger” were used together in the title. After

reading the first chapter, I had a deep appreciation for what this could mean for every follower of Christ. As we consider the words of Jesus in this weekend’s Gospel story of the nameless rich man and the poor beggar Lazarus, let us learn to live every moment with integrity. The resource introduced the topics this way:

“As pilgrims and strangers, we are called to be signs of transcendence and of a fullness that is offered to us now and which is attained beyond the limits of time and space. It is a new world of relationships that does not necessarily stand in opposition or contradiction to the one in which we presently live. Rather, it is a world of meaning that begins with our current situation and comes to perfection in eternity.”

On a daily basis, we create and nurture the relationships (now) that shape our eternity. Our world can be fast-paced and indifferent, so we must work hard at being present to others. Like a wake-up call, the formation resource offered the following questions for personal reflection:

1. Do you have friends among the poor?
2. Who was the last poor person that significantly influenced your life? What was the effect?
3. How do you treat the poor who come to the door of your house?
4. Compared to time spent in keeping up with the news, what percentage of your time is dedicated to being aware of and studying the problems of the poor?

5. Do you understand and reflect on reality from the perspective of the poor?

6. When talking about sharing resources with the poor we generally consider communal money. Each of us, however, has money for personal use, for vacation, etc.. How much of this money do you share with the poor?

7. The poor are present in the places where we live. How much of your time do you spend with them?

8. Do you have any contact with and support the social organizations/movements of the poor?

Sacred Heart Parish is not only located in Burlington County, but it is also the Catholic church of the county seat. The poor are very close at hand, as evidenced by the community support that our St. Vincent de Paul Society offers on a regular basis. As the month of October approaches with its **Respect Life** theme, it is helpful to remember Lazarus as we do something now to help others who are in need. A good example is the pro-life ministry **1st Way of Burlington County**, now located on High Street in Burlington.

For more than 35 years, women have come to this ministry for help and comfort. There is always great need. Currently, the non-profit is trying to raise \$25,000 to replace the roof on the building from which they operate. Perhaps this is where we, as pilgrims, can meet strangers and make a difference (and spread the word). Their fund-raising link is:
