Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

*“Whoever Humbles Himself
Will Be Exalted”*

In the reading from the Book of Sirach, the heart of the text is found in one’s interior attitude of humility which makes prayer pleasing to God.

Today’s Gospel illustrates this point with striking clarity. The Pharisee offers God his good deeds as a bribe, confident they will win him a rich reward. The tax collector, completely aware of the enormity of his sin and therefore of his unworthiness, beats his breast and prays, “O God, be merciful to me a sinner.”

St. Luke’s summary repeats the saying about the exalted and humbled which echoes the assertion in Mary’s Magnificat that God has deposed the mighty and raised up the lowly

“The Lord hears the cry of the oppressed. The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds.”

Living the Good News Today

“The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat...”

During a recent visit with our younger daughter, who lives in southeastern Massachusetts, my husband Jeff and I had the opportunity to make a day trip to Cape Cod National Seashore. This delightful experience of autumn in New England afforded us the opportunity to explore this wonderful place without the teeming crowds (and traffic jams) of the summer vacationers. As with our visits to other national parks, we started our exploration by going to the Salt Pond Visitor Center in Eastham, where we met many foreign visitors who were enjoying the centennial celebration of America’s national parks.

After obtaining a National Park Service (NPS) map of Cape Cod, we admired the central feature of the visitor’s lobby, a magnificent map of the Gulf of Maine ecosystem, to which Cape Cod National Seashore belongs. Then, we went into the theater and took in whichever of the five films was playing next. To our great delight, that movie was called “Thoreau’s Cape Cod,” which was a splendid tour of key features of the cape with the narration from Henry David Thoreau’s account of his exploration of this coastal area of Massachusetts from 1849-1857. Those words lingered in our own experience of breathtaking beauty.

Having packed a picnic lunch for the day, we decided to stop at a national park site called “Pilgrim Heights.” To use Thoreau’s description, we were near the “wrist” of Cape Cod’s “arm” facing the Atlantic Ocean. At the picnic pavilion, there was a NPS display marking the significance of this place as the second “discoverie” of the pilgrims when they first landed at Cape Cod in November 1620. Their three exploratory ventures were related to survival, as these settlers were in critical need of fresh water and food. Both of us marveled at the courage of these people, who had set foot on these lands almost 400 years before us!

As the Church celebrates World Mission Sunday this weekend, the words of Saint Paul to Timothy reminded me of historical echoes of what sustained so many other people of faith and hope who came before us, desiring religious freedom and a better life: *“But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength...and I was rescued from the lion’s mouth, The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat.”* For approximately 130 people on board the Mayflower, those threats included 66 days on treacherous seas, meager and dwindling provisions, severe New England winter weather, epidemics of fatal diseases, and threatening encounters with Native Americans as they tried to establish their settlement. Yet it was faith that had given them the courage to leave their homeland. Soon, our schoolchildren will remember this legacy as they study

the history of the pilgrims prior to our national celebration of Thanksgiving. How important it is to remember the humility of the pilgrims’ faith in God to protect them from evil and threat!

During this same trip, we were sad to learn of the passing into eternal life of our dear friend Sister Louise Fafard, a 96-year old religious of the Sisters of Holy Cross, whom we had met in Franklin, NH, while our oldest daughter attended her college orientation. The sisters had invited us to celebrate the feast of the Assumption at a local nursing home, followed by daily visits for Mass at their convent. A bilingual community (French and English), these “retired” sisters continued to minister at the local nursing home, state prison, and parish in that area until their order had to sell their property and relocated the remaining sisters to their US motherhouse in Manchester.

Over the years that we knew these sisters, their remarkable faith, courage, and hope-filled service to the communities in Canada and New England to which they were assigned inspired so many people to persevere. When the sisters were in daily contact with people, they frequently participated in discussions about the profound evil that people saw on the news: acts of terrorism, violence, religious persecution, and injustice. The sisters, like the tax collector in this weekend’s Gospel parable, knew the power of humble prayer and they constantly invited people who were fearful and anxious to pray wholeheartedly and to trust in God. As this community observed their 175th jubilee this year as the Sisters of Holy Cross, those to whom they had ministered could reflect on their faithful commitment to proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ by their very lives and actions, so full of joy and hope.

In our friendship with Sister Louise and her biological sister (Sister Marie Rose), our family was asked to pray for the canonization of their beloved Blessed André Bessette, a humble religious brother who had served the sick in Quebec. Those prayers were answered when Pope Benedict XVI canonized him as the first saint of the Holy Cross congregation on October 17, 2010. Both sisters lived to see that day!

Saint Paul described our earthly journey as a race in which we must compete with faith. Reflecting on the pilgrims, the congregation of the Holy Cross, and St. André Bessette, we can see that we have many companions on our journey who humbly assure us that the Lord is always beside us as we run the race and keep the faith:
