Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Funerals

In all cases, the family of the deceased parishioner should contact the funeral home directly. They will contact the Church to make further arrangements. For information regarding our Parish Cemetery, please call the Cemetery Office at 609-702-1848 ext 304

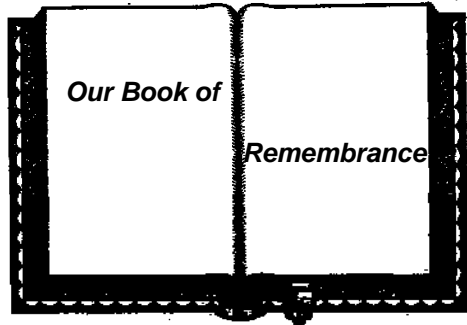

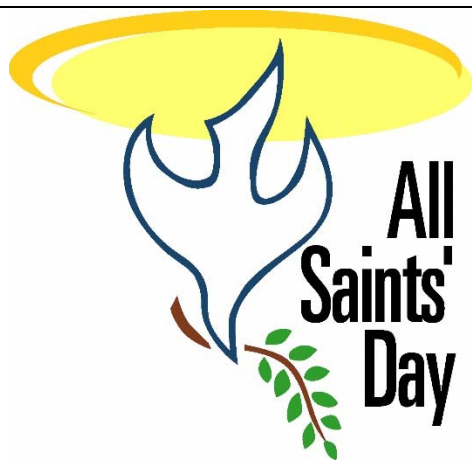


REMEMBERING THOSE WHOM WE HAVE LOVED

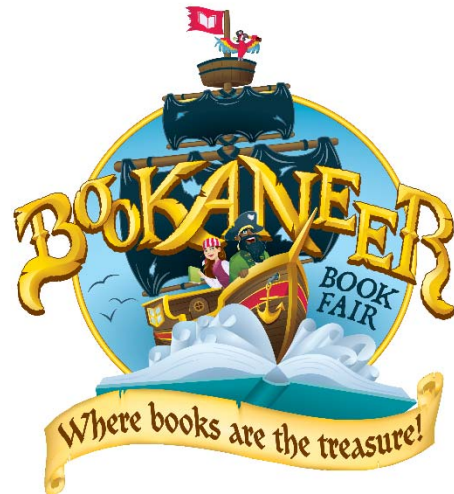

ISN'T KNOWLEDGE A WONDERFUL THING!!

"Have you climbed a tree lately?"

At first glance that's quite an odd question but our Gospel invites us to consider that action in a symbolic way. Jesus was a known preacher and there was something about Him that peeked the interest of this well-known, wealthy tax collector named Zacchaeus? What was it about this itinerant preacher that caused so much attention around this area? Now it's important to remember that the tax collectors of those days were without regulation. Their job was to get the money required by the Roman government but it was up to the individual tax collector to figure out what additional fees might be added for their own profit. The tax collector was considered a thief and was most often shunned by others in the community because he oppressed others by his business tactics.

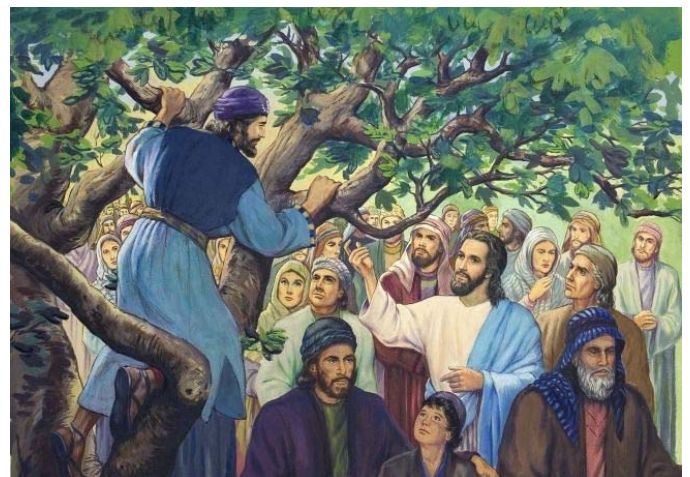
It is quite possible that this man was hearing about Jesus' radical message of love and was attracted to it even though it would put all that he had accumulated at risk. Maybe he was tired of being lonely in his own community and was prepared to change. Perhaps there were seeds planted through other events in his life that opened his heart to change, just a little. So Zacchaeus climbs a tree so he can really see or perhaps study this preacher named Jesus from afar. Perhaps Zacchaeus just wanted to see what was attracting all these people to Jesus. And then it happened The great invitation ... Followed by criticism by others and mercy by Jesus. Wow!

Perhaps you have been a witness to this in your own life. The person who suffers from an addiction finally finds a relationship with their higher power and then is criticized for their past life, because everyone remembers --- except Our Lord. The other one is that bedside conversion -- right before death when a person asks forgiveness -- how difficult it is for the people in their lives to forgive -- but we know that Our Lord guarantees us mercy.

He waits -- ever so patiently to be invited into our lives. There are events and people in our lives forever inviting us to seek Him -- to climb that proverbial tree to see Him more closely. Perhaps that tree is a Bible study, a discussion to understand more with a person that seems to walk more closely with Jesus, an hour in Eucharistic Adoration in our Chapel of the two hearts ... And then wait, He will notice you and offer to come to your home within your thoughts and heart in our daily lives.

We can learn a lot from Zacchaeus. He sought Jesus and from simply seeking Him, Zacchaeus discovered all that he truly was called to be in his life. St. Paul tells us in the second reading that "God may make you worthy of his calling and powerfully bring to fulfillment every good purpose and every effort of faith, that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him"

So this week, let's climb that symbolic tree and look for the "lover of souls, for 'His' imperishable spirit is in all things, and allow the God of mercy to invite Himself into our lives. Once we truly receive God's mercy, let us all share His mercy with all of those in our lives.
