Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

During the holy season of Lent, from Ash Wednesday, March 1st, to Holy Thursday, April 13th, you are strongly encouraged to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion, to receive the Sacrament of Penance, to attend Lenten devotions and the Stations of the Cross, to read the Scriptures prayerfully, and to perform acts of self-denial and works of mercy.

PRAYER:

Daily Mass is celebrated at 7am & 8:30am. Weekend Mass and Confession times can be found on the front of the bulletin.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help Novena is held every Wednesday at 7:15pm in the chapel. Stations of the Cross are held at 4pm & 7pm every Friday during the Lenten Season. Eucharistic Adoration is Monday through Friday from 9am to 9pm in the Parish House Chapel.

The days of fast and abstinence are ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY. The other Fridays of Lent are DAYS OF ABSTINENCE.

FEDERAL DONOR RECORDKEEPING RULE ON CHARITABLE DEDUCTION

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 included a section relative to charitable deductions. The rules require that people claiming charitable deduction back up those deduction claims with cancelled checks; records from banks or credit card companies; or written notices from the charity or not-for-profit institution. The burden is on the donor to maintain or obtain the required records.

The parish will provide a record of contributions, upon request, which will satisfy the IRS requirements. Contributions of cash can only be used as a deduction if church envelopes are used enabling the parish to identify the donor. 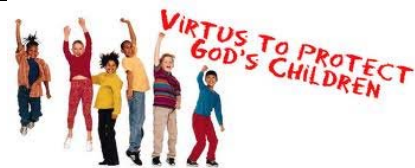
CEMETERY NEWS

Living the Good News Today

*“It is of course required of stewards
that they be found trustworthy.”*

Last weekend, we had Sunday family dinner at my house, which brought great enjoyment to all of us. Although the dining room table was set before our youngest son arrived with his family, his older son wanted to help by filling the water glasses. As he went back and forth from the table to the kitchen, he noticed an appealing calligraphy wall calendar that I had hung on the dining room wall. This perceptive first grader proceeded to tell me that my calendar was wrong. So, I glanced over to see make sure it was opened to February, then shared my puzzlement with him about what he had seen “wrong.” Pointing to my calendar, he observed that we were not crossing off dates to mark time, so he wanted me to fix that. For me, this was one of those huggable moments with children when they teach us to slow down, pay attention, and appreciate where we are and what we are doing.

When Catholics celebrate the liturgical year, we not only mark time, but we also consecrate it by our praying and living in the grace of God. This week, the Church will change seasons, moving from Ordinary Time to the penitential season of Lent. If we marked off the days as my grandson had expected, what would we find in that daily consciousness? How close are we to God in our daily journey of activities? Would we honestly ask ourselves what we might have missed during our busy days and be more attentive tomorrow?

The readings for this weekend are an excellent prelude to Lent. In his letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul describes the humility with which Christians should be regarded by others: *“as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God.”* His instruction makes it clear that God not only judges WHAT we do, but also the motives in our hearts. How different our Lenten journey could be if we listened more carefully to the Word of God and changed our hearts to be full of the desire to serve Christ with every fiber of our being—to be stewards of God’s Creation!

After reminding the Corinthians that they are to be servants and stewards, St. Paul further qualified his instruction with these words: *“Now it is of course required of stewards that they be found trustworthy.”* For the true disciple of Christ, there can be no duplicity of agendas. Although the world can tempt us with choices to make, not all worldly desires lead us to God. To remain true to God, we must listen carefully to the Word and to take our promises to God seriously.

In his Message for Lent this year, Pope Francis reflected on Jesus’ parable of the rich man and Lazarus,

which included a quote from this weekend’s Gospel: *“No one can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or be attached to the first and despise the second. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money”*

The Holy Father observed that the rich man had no name in the parable. To what had he become a slave? Love of riches, lavish outward appearances, and self-idolatry? He left no earthly legacy of being a steward who had been trustworthy. Instead, he had failed to notice so much in his lifetime, especially poor Lazarus!

In reflecting on how sin can bind us, Pope Francis noted that the rich man’s *“opulence was seen in his extravagant and expensive robes... The man was clearly ostentatious about his wealth, and in the habit of displaying it daily... In him we can catch a dramatic glimpse of the corruption of sin, which progresses in three successive stages: love of money, vanity and pride... Money can come to dominate us, even to the point of becoming a tyrannical idol... Instead of being an instrument at our service for doing good and showing solidarity towards others, money can chain us and the entire world to a selfish logic that leaves no room for love and hinders peace.”* For serious and trustworthy stewards, wealth is a privilege that also carries responsibilities and leads to gratitude.

In his Lenten message, Pope Francis offers the Church a theme: ***“The Word is a gift. Other persons are a gift.”*** Citing the Word of God as the basis for everything, the Holy Father sees Lent as an urgent call to conversion—to respond to God’s invitation to hear and ponder more deeply the desire to change our hearts. When we rediscover the gift of God’s Word, we begin to see differently and to *“serve Christ present in our brothers and sisters in need.”* This attitude can radically change our Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

There is a real spiritual blessing that comes from marking time, especially when it is done with other people—like grandchildren! ☺ Even if a person is unable to attend daily Mass, there is still the opportunity to read the daily Scripture readings (cf. <http://www.usccb.org>). Praying over the Word of God can lead our hearts to more deliberate action as God’s servants and stewards.

What if we had the chance to experience Jesus in our midst like His disciples did? Would Jesus find us anxious about what to eat, drink, or wear, or where to go, what to do, and how to get there? If we too hastily answered “No” to that question, would He find us worrying about our bills, health, unfinished business, or future? Psalm 62 teaches us very simply how important it is to know that our strength and salvation come only from God, so we must devote our daily focus with this implicit trust:

“Rest in God alone.”
