Parish Registration

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Funerals

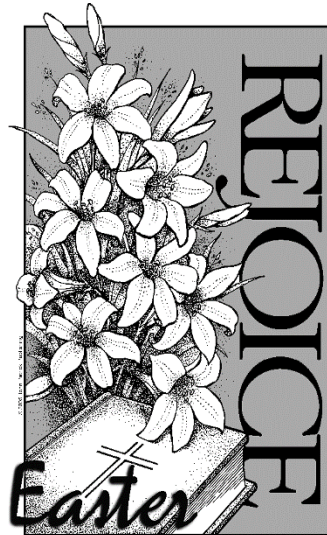

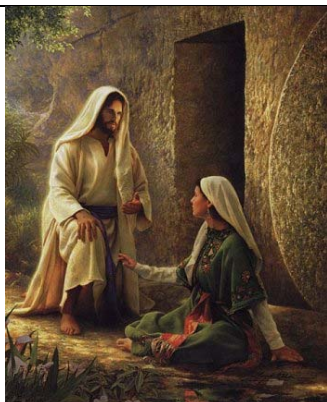

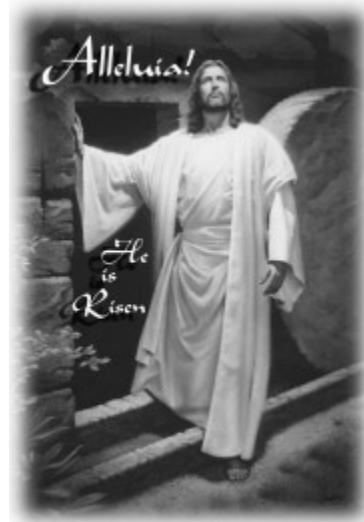

Have Mercy on Us – a Volunteer Opportunity!

Did you know that a large number of incarcerated people actually suffer from a mental health disorder. Once on appropriate medication, these offenders come to understand appropriate behavior and can re-enter our society as well-balanced persons. The problem that has existed for a long time is that people being released from prison are usually without medical insurance. So they become well-balanced in prison and upon release are off their medications. This system doomed to defeat must be corrected.

That is where the Burlington County Council of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul needs your help. We have been able to form a collaborative agreement with many groups (Board of Chosen Freeholders, County Social Services, Jail/Prison administration etc.) to work together so that an offender being discharged has the medical care that they need to help prevent this avenue of reoccurring imprisonment. When someone has to go to jail to get medical care there is something terribly wrong. If you would be able to volunteer one day a month – a Wednesday – from 1pm to 3pm – to assist offenders to fill out Medicaid forms please continue to read this!!! You would have to be a person of a clean criminal history and be willing to be present in an all-purpose room in the jail or prison. You would go through an orientation so that you would have a comfort level prior to the beginning of this volunteer activity. This is a secure environment so you will not be at risk. ISN'T KNOWLEDGE A WONDERFUL THING!!

Easter Sunday – celebrating the newness of life!

Easter Sunday brings out all the finest clothes, bright shiny faces of children as they wear their fanciest clothes, well except for the little chocolate marks from the first bites of candy found in their baskets earlier that morning!

Today we celebrate and welcome so many of our Catholic family members “home.” From the moment we are baptized, we become a member of this incredibly large family. Each person significant and each member missed when they are not with us in worship. So today, if you are reading this column, please consider yourself “most welcome,” whether you have been with us every week or if you haven't stopped by to visit Our Lord as of late. We, welcome you home, with the love of a family member.

Easter Sunday has so many choices of readings and so many of them reference beginning a new way of life. All of us know that life can give us the most amazing moments and it can also deliver the most shocking events. Our lives are all full of dying and rising again. Our Mass celebrates the Paschal Mystery, the dying and rising of Jesus Christ. When we look at the life of Jesus we realize that for every death there will be a resurrection and for every time of sorrow there will be a time of joy.

As Catholic Christians during this Easter Season, which concludes on Pentecost Sunday, June 4th of this year, we are invited to roll away the stone of our own sinfulness and to follow the Risen Jesus. We are commissioned to spread the Word of God just as the apostles were so long ago. So how do we do that?

Let's begin with love! In one of the recommended Gospel readings for today we

hear the story of Mary Magdalene and the other Mary going to the tomb to “serve” Our Lord by caring for his deceased body. As they reached the tomb they witnessed a miracle – the Lord had risen! Oftentimes in the readings in scripture you will notice that it is those who serve that have opportunities to see miracles (big and small.) The two women at the tomb were in fact the first to know of the Resurrection. The servants at the wedding feast were the first to witness the initial miracle of Jesus' ministry. Those who choose to serve at our Masses on Easter Sunday see the miracle of “family” hundreds of times throughout the day.

All of our lives can feel like a roller coaster ride with the ups and downs that life presents. As Catholics we are anchored firmly on that roller coaster ride with a depth of faith in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We learn from the life of Jesus Christ to depend on the Father and His great love for each one of us and on the Holy Spirit to inspire our daily walk.

Today we celebrate the gift of our Savior as His resurrection assures all of us of eternal life. Let's all follow the lead of the women who found the empty tomb and let us all “rejoice” as we share the Good News.
