Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Dear Parishioners of Sacred Heart Church,

I am truly happy to inform you that, with the wholehearted endorsement of the Parish Finance Council, I have requested permission from Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. to construct a new parking lot for our Church and School. Bishop O'Connell has approved this request. To date, our parish has already pledged over \$460,000.00 to the Faith to Move Mountains Campaign with the assurance that 30% of the actual contributions made to this Campaign would be returned to Sacred Heart to be used for parish projects, the most important being a new parking lot. I am sincerely grateful to all those who were able to make such generous contributions to this Campaign. I would also like to express my deep gratitude to the many parishioners who made private contributions to the parking lot project. In addition, I would like to extend my sincere appreciation to the Knights of Columbus, Santa Maria Council 1179 for sponsoring the Charlie Zahm/Tad Marks concert. The free will offering collected at the concert combined with the matching funds provided by the Knights of Columbus brought an additional \$5,000.00 to the parking lot project.

The sacrifices made and generosity displayed by so many are truly amazing and are such an inspiring demonstration of your love of Sacred Heart Parish.

We are planning to begin the construction of our new parking lot on Monday, June 26 and complete the work by Friday, June 30.

I am so honored and blessed to be part of this wonderful parish and so thankful to you for your faithful and prayerful presence and support of our Church. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus continue to bless and protect this parish so lovingly dedicated to Him and continue to keep you and your loved ones in His care.

“Living in Hope!”

As we journey through the Gospels we find Jesus so often gathering at table with the rich and the poor, with sinners and those who thought they were above sin, with the old and young. Everyone was welcome at a table with Jesus. It was so simple – all are welcome!

Sometimes I think that the message of Our Lord was so simple that most of us miss it in our daily lives. As we experience our first reading and hear Peter the apostle standing before the crowds, he is reminding everyone of the many years, even generations that the Jews waited in the hope of a Messiah. He reflects back to the prophet, King David, who foretold all that was happening. Peter points out to all present what David shared and how Jesus Christ fulfilled those prophecies. King David, prophet and king was a constant bearer of hope to his people.

In all three readings today we hear about hope. One of the three great virtues: faith, hope and charity (love). When we think about hope it is an amazing catalyst, it is an incredible gift that propels people to continue living, to continue giving and to continue loving. Hope is born of faith! Without faith as the seed there is no hope at all. Our Responsorial Psalm today is “Lord, you will show us the path of life.” It is faith in that path that causes the hope that propels all of us to follow the path.

Faith and Hope together prompt Love. It is with hope in the future (earthly and eternal) that enlightens so many of our

decisions. Years ago an immigrant family came to our community. The parents worked tirelessly all in the hope that their children would receive a good education and have a better life than they did. Their faith and hope in their children and their sacrificial love led their family to be a faith-filled ever appreciative family. For generations to come these former immigrants, now citizens, will be remembered by their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren for their gift of faith, hope and love.

Today we hear the words of King David through the mouth of Peter twenty eight generations after they were spoken by King David. Now that is Hope! Here we are 1984 years after the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and we are still banking on His words about life, death and eternal life. We have faith that Jesus Christ is Lord and with that faith, we have hope that we will join Jesus in the Resurrection from the dead.

Over and over we are invited to the table with Jesus through the breaking of the bread. Rich and poor, sinners and saints, young and old we gather. As faithful, hopeful people do we approach the table with great love and with compassion in our heart for all of those who struggle to find hope and are we willing, after being replenished at the table of the Lord, to recognize Him in all those whom we meet?
