Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Funerals

In all cases, the family of the deceased parishioner should contact the funeral home directly. They will contact the Church to make further arrangements. For information regarding our Parish Cemetery, please call the Cemetery Office at 609-702-1848 ext 304

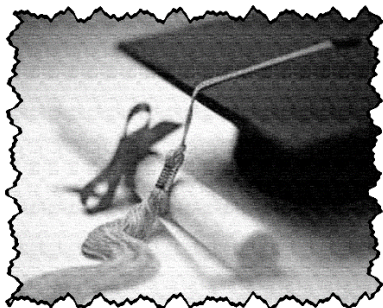

Giving Glory to God by
Prayer and Word

As we listen to the readings this Sunday, the words, prayer and glorification are prominent. In the upper room Mary with the apostles and disciples “devoted themselves with one accord to prayer”.

St. Peter addresses an early community of Christians who are sharing in the sufferings of Christ to remain steadfast in the Spirit of glory. Jesus prays during this Gospel to His Heavenly Father. His compassion for His people is deep “... I pray for them... for the ones you have given me.” The Cross and the Resurrection are so close in the theology of John’s Gospel that Jesus’ prayer just before His Passion is about glorification.

Through His teaching and preaching, through His healing and prayer, Jesus points to God’s love, mercy, compassion and justice. The words of Jesus are a model for all who minister in His church.

Who from the halls of heaven came
To travel landscapes bare and bleak
For those that only love would seek.”

The Grapes of Wrath Project

Through the 'read the book - see the movie' programs that we offer here are Sacred Heart Parish, I hope that we address several purposes. That we will read some really good books. That we will increase our understanding of our faith. That we will broaden our understanding of the human condition. To travel, in spirit, to go far beyond the mere superficial. To be entertained and inspired by watching good films. To engage one another in stimulating conversations. No doubt, a tall order and with the 2017 summer project, we will cover all of these bases.

John Steinbeck's *Grapes of Wrath* is one of the greatest novels in American literature and the film version, directed by John Ford, was listed at #21 by the American Film Institute's best movies of all time. This summer, we are in for a monumental treat and all of you are invited to participate. Please give it some thought. *The Grapes of Wrath* will affect how you look at life.

The Grapes of Wrath. In stark and moving detail, Steinbeck's compelling saga depicts the lives of ordinary people striving to preserve their humanity in the face of social and economic desperation. When the Joad family lose their farm in Oklahoma, they join thousands of others, traveling to the 'promised land' of California. A portrait of the bitter conflict between the powerful and the powerless, one man's fierce reaction to injustice and a woman's quiet, stoical strength, *The Grapes of Wrath* is a landmark of American writing, one that captures the horrors of the Great Depression as it probes into the very nature of equality and justice in America. Clearly, *The Grapes of Wrath*, though set in the 1930's is as current as tomorrow's newspaper; it is storytelling that transcends time.

So, begin your reading of *The Grapes of Wrath* and save the date, Friday evening - September 22 - when we will gather to see Ford's classic movie and discuss both novel and film. Look for updates about the novel in future Parish Bulletins.

ISN'T KNOWLEDGE A WONDERFUL THING!!

“Our relationship has changed, not ended!”

Change is an inevitable part of our lives. There are times when we fight it with all of our capacity and other times when we look at it as a natural progression in our lives.

When our first daughter Kate went away to college I remember helping her unpack her possessions in her new dorm room and doing all that I possibly could to fight the tears that were trying to roll down my cheeks. Within that first year I learned that Kate would never be far from my thoughts and that the only thing that changed in our relationship was that she was no longer at the dinner table. As the other kids launched into their college and career lives, and answered the invitations that life's opportunities offered them, I was much better at encouraging them to go where God led them. I want you to notice something. The word “encourage” has the word “courage” within it. To encourage others often means finding the courage to let go, to allow change and to find a new way to love. In all the changes and moves of our four children what I learned is that I could be with our children, no matter where they lived, through prayer every day. As our family expanded over the years to eight adult children and two grandchildren and another one coming shortly, prayer for the whole family is a daily communication with Our Lord.

In our Gospel today we encounter the prayer that Jesus shared as He prepared to meet His Father prior to His Ascension. There is one verse that speaks to every one of us. Jesus says to His Father, “I pray for them.”

He goes onto speak of the people that have heard the words of the Father through Him and who are not of this world although in it. Jesus in that moment was praying for every one of us. As Jesus left His followers, their relationship changed. He was no longer physically there but He was there in prayer. All of us receive that same gift.

As I hope all of you know by now, I will be retiring from Sacred Heart after twenty six years. It has truly been an honor and a privilege to walk with our parish family all these years. I often said, “I wish every parish member could sit in my chair for one day and see the goodness within this parish. The needs that are met by the kindness of individuals and of our ministries has often left me in awe, as people are inspired by the work of God within us.


So just as the kids moved out and I still carry them in my mind and heart through prayer every day, so I will do the same with the dear people of this parish. God has blessed me to know you, to serve you and yes, even to love you. I believe that the Holy Spirit led me to be with you and I believe that He has led me to this next step in my faith journey. A special note of thanks to Fr. John who has been beyond gracious in receiving the news of my retirement and encouraging me to go where I believe God is leading me. I hope to see many of you in the future as I worship at Sacred Heart and in the meantime, *May Our Blessed Lord hold you in the palm of His hand.*
