The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Through the 'read the book - see the movie' programs that we offer here are Sacred Heart Parish, I hope that we address several purposes. That we will read some really good books. That we will increase our understanding of our faith. That we will broaden our understanding of the human condition. To travel, in spirit, to go far beyond the mere superficial. To be entertained and inspired by watching good films. To engage one another in stimulating conversations. No doubt, a tall order and with the 2017 summer project, we will cover all of these bases.

John Steinbeck's *Grapes of Wrath* is one of the greatest novels in American literature and the film version, directed by John Ford, was listed at #21 by the American Film Institute's best movies of all time. This summer, we are in for a monumental treat and all of you are invited to participate. Please give it some thought. *The Grapes of Wrath* will affect how you look at life.

The Grapes of Wrath. In stark and moving detail, Steinbeck's compelling saga depicts the lives of ordinary people striving to preserve their humanity in the face of social and economic desperation. When the Joad family lose their farm in Oklahoma, they join thousands of others, traveling to the 'promised land' of California. A portrait of the bitter conflict between the powerful and the powerless, one man's fierce reaction to injustice and a woman's quiet, stoical strength, *The Grapes of Wrath* is a landmark of American writing, one that captures the horrors of the Great Depression as it probes into the very nature of equality and justice in America. Clearly, *The Grapes of Wrath*, though set in the 1930's is as current as tomorrow's newspaper; it is storytelling that transcends time.

So, begin your reading of *The Grapes of Wrath* and save the date, Friday evening - September 22 - when we will gather to see Ford's classic movie and discuss both novel and film. Look for updates about the novel in future Parish Bulletins.

Living the Good News Today

“You renew the face of the earth.”

Many times in my life I have had experiences that are even more incredible and wondrous because they intersected with some other unexpected activity or encounter and left me profoundly aware of how God is at work in our lives. While some people might be inclined to explain what happened as coincidental and just good luck, I like to savor the expression that *“There are no coincidences with God.”* As the Church celebrates Pentecost, I would like to reflect on one of those coincidences that must have left the apostles with a sense of awe and wonder at how God works!

While serving at McGuire AFB, I would frequently visit the base chapel. In the vestibule of both chapels, the chaplains used to set out literature for people to take and enrich their faith. These pamphlets included Catholic, Protestant, and Jewish spiritual materials. I especially enjoyed taking the handouts from the Jewish chaplain and learning more about the customs and traditions of the faith in which Jesus was raised. I still refer to those pamphlets when I prepare for prison ministry!

Did you know that 50 days after Passover, the Jewish faith observes the feast of Shavuoth (the Feast of Weeks)? This feast commemorates the giving of the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai seven weeks after the beginning of Passover. When this event happened, the Israelites entered into a covenant with God, declaring that *“all that the Lord has spoken we shall do.”* (Exodus 19:8)

In this weekend’s readings, the Acts of the Apostles begins by remarking that *“the time for Pentecost was fulfilled.”* The word “Pentecost” was used by Hellenist (Greek) Jews to describe Shavuoth. So, the apostles, Mary, and other disciples of Jesus were in Jerusalem marking this Feast of Weeks in which Jews were renewing that covenant with God and reaffirming the historic seven-week journey from slavery to redemption to freedom to responsibility.

While so many faithful Jews were in Jerusalem observing the Feast of Shavuoth, God sent the Holy Spirit upon the Church. Such a coincidence! Just as Jesus had observed His last Passover with His disciples, the Holy Spirit was now with that faith community to help them understand what Jesus meant when He gave them a “new and everlasting covenant.” No coincidence that this happened seven weeks after Passover on the feast marking the covenant with God. The responsorial psalm

(Psalm 104) was written before Jesus, but the author understood the wondrous work of God in the world: *“When You send forth Your spirit, they are created, and You renew the face of the earth.”*

As Catholics, our celebration of Pentecost directs us to the renewal that is always at work in the world through the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. The Acts of the Apostles captures for us the transforming moment in salvation history when the fullness of the Holy Trinity was revealed and God was renewing the face of the earth. It must have been so amazing to those who had gathered in Jerusalem to hear the apostles proclaiming the Good News and to be able to understand them in so many different languages!

To this day, one of the traditions of Shavuoth is to recite the liturgical poem Akdamut, written by the 11th century Rabbi Meir ben Issac Nehorai. This poem extols the greatness of God, who gave His people the Law and prepared a wondrous future for the pure and upright of heart in the world to come. The Jewish chaplain’s handout highlighted keywords from this poem that are part of our Catholic tradition, too:

“We are His choice. Then let us rejoice that He blessed us and gave us the Law.”

Isn’t it simply incredible how God sent the Holy Spirit on the Feast of Shavuoth? If anyone were to spend significant time reflecting on God’s Law and then renewing their commitment to living by the covenant, would their hearts and minds be open to what was proclaimed by the apostles? On that first Pentecost, many people in Jerusalem saw, heard, and were moved to be baptized in this Spirit of God. As Jesus taught the apostles, so would they go out into the world and teach others about God’s law of love, a new and everlasting covenant with His people.

Twenty centuries have passed since that first Christian Pentecost happened. We can appreciate what St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians when he said that *“No one can say that ‘Jesus is Lord’ except by the Holy Spirit.”* When Jesus came to teach us the Way, the Truth, and the Life, He transformed the world that had been so broken by sin. This weekend is a very good time to reflect on our baptism and confirmation, when the Holy Spirit transformed our own lives and called us into something much bigger than ourselves. Jesus has taught us that the Law is much more than simple compliance with rules and regulations. The face of the earth is renewed when we remember true communion:

“For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body.”
