Parish Registration

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

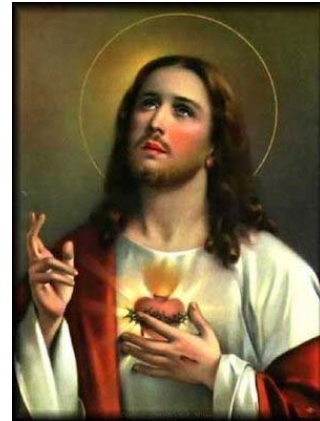

Dear Sacred Heart parishioners,
Our 2016-2017 Religious Education year ended in April, and the year seemed to go by in the blink of an eye! Within this busy year, made busier still by a significant change to our class schedule and a new textbook series, we also experienced the privilege of sharing in the sacramental celebrations of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation with our children and their families. In addition, Amy Raimondi, our Administrative Assistant, also took on the task of starting Youth Ministry here, which offered the children of our parish and school additional ways of growing in their faith. So while the year may have been a bit more hectic than usual, it was also a particularly wonderful and faith-filled year as well!

At the core of all of this was, as always, our dedicated volunteers. It is our volunteers who really make the Religious Education program here not only possible, but wonderful as they bring our faith to life for our children through their instruction and example. I am continually impressed and inspired by the commitment of our volunteers to our parish and to our children, even more so this year as many of our long-time volunteers enthusiastically embraced so much change in a relatively short period of time! I am so very grateful for the unique gifts they each bring to our Religious Education program, and for the time they take to ensure that our children learn about the God who loves them when they come to their classes at Sacred Heart.

While aspects of a Religious Education program such as schedules and books may change depending on the needs of children and families, one thing that never changes is the vital role of the parish in handing on the faith to our children. As we are already preparing for our 2017 – 2018 Religious Education year, we are seeking out additional volunteers who would like to join the wonderful little catechetical community we have here in

our parish. Here are some ways you can get involved if you would like to join us this year:

- Summer Program: This special intensive program for grades 1st through 8th runs from July 17-July 28, 8 am – 11 am daily Monday through Friday. A great benefit for the children and the volunteers is we all attend Mass together daily. Children also attend class one Monday per month from October through April.
- Fall Program: This is our traditional weekly program during the school year. Children in grades 1st through 8th attend classes Tuesdays or Wednesdays from 5:30 pm – 6:45 pm from the end of September through the end of April.

We are currently looking for catechists (formerly known as “CCD teachers” ☺) and aides for both our Summer and Fall Programs. We offer classes for catechists, which we invite aides to attend as well. Thank you in advance for your prayerful consideration and we look forward to welcoming new members to our wonderful group for the upcoming year! Living the Good News Today

“The one who feeds on Me will have life because of Me.”

In the early 1990s, I had the wonderful daily privilege of praying Morning Prayer (Lauds) with a group of Franciscan friars. As was their communal tradition, they did a prelude to the Liturgy of the Hours by reciting the words of St. Francis of Assisi that friars were to repeat with every visit to any church:

“We adore You, Most Holy Lord Jesus Christ, here and in all the churches throughout the world, and we bless You, because by Your holy Cross, You have redeemed the world.”

I was quite familiar with these words, especially because they are used in the Lenten Stations of the Cross. However, there was a second part to the friars’ prayer that I felt was quite wondrously complementary in adoration of the Lord:

“O Sacred Banquet in which Christ is received, the memory of His Passion is recalled. The soul is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us. You have given them Bread from heaven, having within it all goodness.”

On the Sunday that follows Pentecost, the Church always observes the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). In his 25th year of the pontificate, St. John Paul II released his last encyclical, *Ecclesia Eucharistia*, on Holy Thursday (April 17, 2003). At the beginning of the Third Millennium, the Holy Father wanted to reawaken the Church to the importance of the Eucharist in our faith.

- *The Church was born of the paschal mystery. At every celebration of the Eucharist, we are spiritually brought back to the paschal Triduum: to the events of the evening of Holy*

Thursday, to the Last Supper and to what followed it. (3)

- *To contemplate Christ involves being able to recognize Him wherever He manifests Himself, in His many forms of presence, but above all in the living sacrament of His Body and his Blood. (6)*

In addition to weekend Mass, there are other ways to increase devotion to the Eucharist: attendance at daily Mass; short visits to the tabernacle to spend time in prayer; or deliberate contemplative time in Eucharistic adoration.

At the corner of our Parish House, there is a small chapel which offers us the opportunity for silent prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. Since this Eucharistic adoration was started in 1994, I have looked

forward to my weekly “Holy Hour” in God’s Presence. Over the years, I have made up a little tote bag which holds my contemplative “tools”: my prayer journal, breviary, and two books that are always there (in addition to whatever I have brought for meditation), to remind me of how God reveals Himself to us.

One of those two books was written by Franciscan Sister Ilia Delio: *Ten Evenings with God* (c. 2008). As the title implies, this book has ten short chapters for personal reflection, followed by several reflection questions helpful for journaling. In the quiet of the chapel, there is so much grace that comes from that deliberate detachment from home, family, and work-related matters to spend some time with God!

A compelling spiritual writer, Sr. Ilia examines the revelation that “*God is a communion of persons in love*” in the sixth evening: “*The Gravity of Love.*” At every Mass, we come together as community to share in the mystery of faith. Sr. Ilia gives this insight:

“The author of the fourth Gospel, in a short letter to his disciples, wrote that ‘God is love.’ (1 John 4:8)... We humans and all creatures are created through the Father’s loving expression in the Word/Son and thus we are created within this communion of love. Because we are created through the Word, we are finite expressions of the infinite love of God. Just as the Father’s love overflows into the Son, so too God’s love overflows into us, and just as the Son yearns for the Father, so too we yearn for God.”

In his encyclical, St. John Paul II noted that the Eucharist must spur Christian pilgrims to bring the light of the Gospel into their daily work:

*“Many problems darken the horizon of our time. We need but think of the urgent need to work for peace, to base relationships between peoples on solid premises of justice and solidarity, and to defend human life from conception to its natural end. And what should we say of the thousand inconsistencies of a ‘globalized’ world where the weakest, the most powerless and the poorest appear to have so little hope! It is in this world that Christian hope must shine forth! **For this reason, too, the Lord wished to remain with us in the Eucharist, making His presence in meal and sacrifice the promise of a humanity renewed by His love.**” (19)*

While a fast-paced world may distract and confuse us, the Eucharist remains the enduring covenant of God to meet us in love. When we take the time to contemplate God’s unconditional love for us, we appreciate the trust and surrender that are necessary in faith to do God’s will. So, let us be very aware of the eternal life that Christ has offered to us by pondering the gravity of God’s love:

“Can I freely give myself to God in love?”
