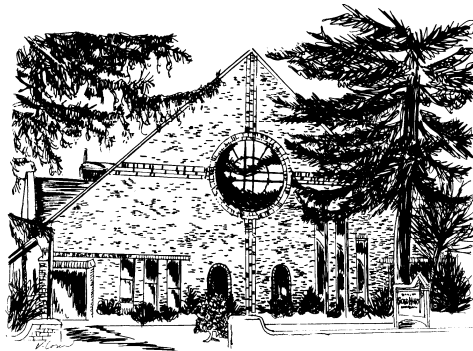

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

St. Matthew in his Gospel account has Jesus speaking of the kingdom of heaven. One of the characteristics of this kingdom is its total reversal of human fortunes and expectations. In today’s Gospel Jesus proclaims that the kingdom is not grasped by “the wise and the learned” “but by the “Childlike.” Jesus speaks to the weary, the oppressed and offers refreshment and relief.

Consider the term “yoke” about which Jesus speaks. Yokes were made for teams of oxen. They were custom-made; each was carefully crafted by the carpenter for the team that would bear it. This wonderful insight may be the inspiration underlying the conviction that “God never places more on our shoulders than we can bear.”

“Oh, God... When I am without pain help me to remember those who suffer; and remembering, help me to destroy my complacency and bestow my compassion. Make me concerned enough to help, by work and deed, those who cry out for what we take for granted.”

The Grapes of Wrath Project

The hot summer is here and the time is right to enjoy a tall, cold drink and read Steinbeck's classic novel, *The Grapes of Wrath*. In this sobering story about the Great Depression of the 1930's, you will be moved and challenged by its passionate message and it will stay with you long after you finish the book.

In order to appreciate Steinbeck's work, let's look at a significant theme of the novel: *Man's Inhumanity to Man.*

Steinbeck consistently points to the fact that the families' great suffering is caused not by bad weather or mere misfortune but by their fellow human beings. Historical, social, and economic circumstances separate people into rich and poor, landowner and tenant, and the people in the dominant roles struggle viciously to preserve their positions. For example, in his brief history of California in Chapter 19, Steinbeck portrays the state as the product of land-hungry squatters who took the land from Mexicans and, by working it and making it produce, rendered it their own. Now, generations later, the California landowners see this historical example as a threat, since they believe that the influx of migrant farmers might cause history to repeat itself. In order to protect themselves from such danger, the landowners create a system in which the migrants are treated like animals, shuffled from one filthy roadside camp to the next, denied livable wages, and forced to turn against their brethren simply to survive. The novel draws a simple line through the population – one that divides the privileged from the poor – and identifies that division as the primary source of evil and suffering in the world.

So, begin your reading of *The Grapes of Wrath* and save the date, Friday evening - September 15 (7pm) - when we will gather to see John Ford's classic movie version and discuss both novel and film. Look for updates about the novel in future Parish Bulletins.

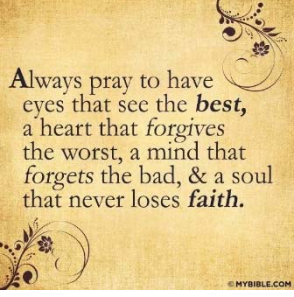

Intensive Introduction to Attic Greek Course at Northeast Catholic College

The importance of learning Greek cannot be overstated. Western literature, drama, philosophy, political systems, all begun in Classical Athens and can be best understood when read in the original. Additionally, learning Attic Greek gives students access to literature not only of that specific era, but back to the works of Homer and forward through Patristic literature to the Byzantines.

This course offers students an intensive survey of Attic Greek grammar and vocabulary over three weeks, covering approximately two semesters worth of material. Additionally, students will begin translating short passages of Greek text.

The course is designed to be an introduction for students interested in the Classics who would like to move more quickly to begin translation courses, or as a resource for teachers of Classical languages such as Latin who would like to begin teaching Greek as well.

This three-week course runs from Monday, July 24 through Friday, August 11, 2017. The cost is \$450 for commuter students and \$750 for residential students (room and board included).
