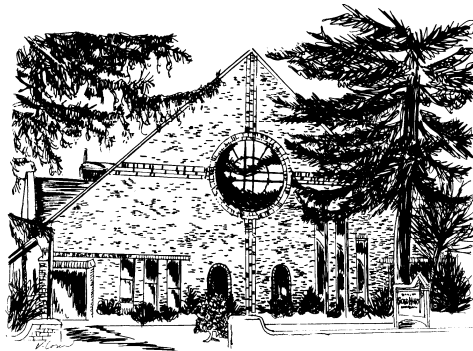

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

OPLATEK – The Christmas Wafer



Christmas wafers are now available in the vestibule of the Church. Please take one home with you.

To use in your home...

Traditionally On Christmas Eve the eldest member of the family takes the Oplatek and turns to the person on his/her right and says, "I wish for you this Christmas...(whatever the wish is). That person breaks off a piece of the wafer and eats it then turns to the next person and the process is repeated.



The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. “Gaudete” is the Latin word for “Rejoice” the first word of the Entrance Antiphon for this Sunday. As it is the mid-point of the Advent Season, rose-colored vestments, instead of purple vestments, may be worn and the rose-colored candle on the Advent Wreath is lit. The lighter color calls us to be filled with hope and encouragement as we continue our journey to the Feast of Christmas.

OR MANGER SCENE**

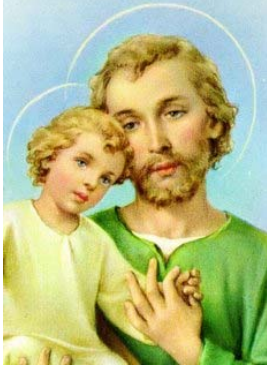


A Christmas Blessing

Testifying to Christ

How often do we take time to rejoice in God and to celebrate with joy all that God has done for us? The Third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday (gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin). On this Sunday we pause to mark the midpoint of our Advent journey. We are given the time to "rejoice heartily in the Lord: and to look forward to all the ways in which the Lord will "make justice and praise spring up" in the future.

Living the Good News Today

"In all circumstances give thanks."

This weekend provides a great opportunity for us to imagine what life in first century A.D. Thessalonika might have been like. As Rome's provincial capital of Macedonia, the city was a bustling seaport located near a fertile coastal plain. It had a population of about 200,000 people. To put things in perspective, Burlington County had an estimated population of 450,000 in 2015. The residents of this city came from all parts of the world—even barbaric Germanic tribes. About one-third of the population were Jewish immigrants. St. Paul found an attentive audience there—Jews and Gentiles alike.

With his companion Silas, St. Paul came to this city to preach as part of his second missionary journey. In this weekend's second reading, we hear St. Paul calling the Thessalonians to holiness through the Holy Spirit with some simple instructions:



1. *Rejoice in the Lord always;*
2. *Pray without ceasing;*
3. *In all circumstances give thanks.*

On the Third Sunday of Advent, the Church lights the rose-colored candle on the Advent wreath to mark the celebration of *Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday*, signifying the nearness of the Lord's coming. In the three little commands that St. Paul shares, it is not the verbs that are significant (*rejoice, pray, and give thanks*), but rather the adverbs of **HOW** to act: *always, without ceasing, and in all circumstances*. Each of those actions requires our undivided attention—our commitment as people who know that the Lord is always near!

Recently, a parish staff member received a call from a man who had been held at the Burlington County Detention Center on Grant Street for several months. The man had been a fallen away Catholic who attended our parish's weekly small faith group experience (Insights) and Communion services while he was there. After his release, he was so grateful to God that he promised to tithe his entire first paycheck to give back something to the prison ministry.

When people are released from prison, it can be very difficult to find employment. During job applications, it is often a liability to have a record of arrest or conviction. In time, this man was able to find a job. When he contacted the Parish House, he was determined to make an offering that could be used to purchase Catholic Bibles for the men at the jail, many of whom are not supported by their families or friends after they are incarcerated. As I read this weekend's readings and lingered on those words "*In all circumstances give thanks,*" I could not help but think about how seriously this man's faith

touched the lives of so many others, most especially mine. His gift will make a difference to others in the year to come!

After he came to our parish and made a cash donation, we were able to order 75 Catholic Bibles for the jail. When I spoke to him, he was so keenly aware of the difficult circumstances through which he had passed, especially the forced separation from his beloved family. For many months, he had been poor, brokenhearted, and a captive, but when he was set free, he saw the hand of God at work, and he was determined to live in God's will. Do we make a little time each day for ourselves to give thanks to God? In all circumstances? Are we grateful even when things don't go the way that we had wished? Perhaps that is the perfect starting point for a daily litany of gratitude.

This weekend's responsorial psalm is taken from the Gospel Canticle of Mary (her Magnificat). Inspired by the Blessed Mother's praying without ceasing, we can open ourselves to the fullness of God's grace during these remaining days of Advent. In his book *Prayers for a Planetary Pilgrim* (c. 1989), the late Fr. Edward Hays captured an attentive longing to be close to God in his *Psalm of an Advent Ear*:

With prayerful pleas and Advent songs of longing, I await the birth of God's Anointed One.

Come, O Gift of heaven's harmony and attune my third ear, the ear of my heart, so that I may hear, just as Mary, faithful woman of Israel, heard.

O God, the time is short, these days are too few as I prepare for the feast of the birth of Mary's Son.

Busy days, crowded to the brim, with long lists of gifts to buy and things that must be done.

Show to me, also Your highly favored child, how to guard my heart from noise and hurry's whirl, so that I might hear Your voice calling my heart to create an empty space that might be pregnant with heaven's life.

Quiet me within, clothe my body in peacefulness, that Your Word once again may take flesh—this time, within me—as once it did in holy Mary, long Advent days ago.

The days of Advent are rapidly drawing closer to our Christmas celebration. As our days are filled with many commitments, let us take time each day to pray [unceasingly] and to give thanks [in all circumstances]. We will have so many opportunities to intersect our lives with others. When our grateful hearts are full of God's love, as Mary teaches us, then we can give an extraordinary greeting to those people whom we encounter:

"Rejoice in the Lord always"
