Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

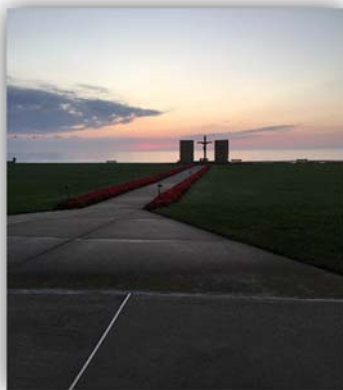

Living the Good News Today

"Beloved, we are God's children now."

One of the greatest experiences of life is to be a grandparent. When we spend time with our six grandchildren, we are always amazed by their curiosity about the world...questions that come as only children can shape them. Like his siblings before him, our youngest grandson (18 months old) has been attending a preschool program called *Makin' Music* for several months. It was unforgettable to watch him learn what the drum brings to music! Recently, though, he discovered how to turn his breath into music with a recorder. Our daughter-in-law snapped a short video of him blowing into the recorder, and then stopping to giggle at himself. Do we cherish such simple delights?

My husband Jeff and I recently returned from a two-week mission trip to Kingston, Jamaica, where we helped the Missionaries of the Poor (MOP) in their various centers for disabled and abandoned men, women, and children. On my first day at Jacob's Well (women's center), a place that I had greatly enjoyed on previous visits, I quickly noticed that the brothers did not bring out the conga drum and tambourines nor lead the residents in singing. Although they still proclaimed the daily Gospel, gave a short reflection, and led grace before the midday meal to the women, I greatly missed the energy and the joy that the music had previously brought to our communal prayers.

That night when our team reunited, I shared this disappointing experience with other members of our team, who were assigned to other centers. They had noted the same difference this year. The one thing that remained unchanged, however, was that no matter which center we visited, the brothers took their fourth vow of service to Christ in the poor passionately. Their ministry totally embraced being God's beloved and that "*we are God's children now*," as St. John reminds us in this weekend's epistle.

Two days later, Br. Francisco brought out the conga drum and smilingly approached a young woman (Kimberly) with Down's syndrome and asked her to provide percussion during the prayer-songs. At first, she was reluctant to do this, but the brother brought two other residents who knew how to drum to help her out if she stumbled. And then, the song began... "*What a Mighty God We Serve*" (one of my hand-clapping favorites)! As I looked around at all of the women, many of them in wheelchairs with great disabilities and some who were blind, the look of transformation and joy on their faces was just like seeing my grandson making music with such glee. Our little drummer-in-training and her two kind helpers were living proof of the joy and love that people with Down's syndrome bring into our communities. Through Jesus, God has called all of us to be His children.

All that we have to do is to listen to and follow Jesus, our Shepherd.



After returning from Jamaica, I had the chance to skim over the new apostolic exhortation that Pope Francis released on the feast of St. Joseph (March 19th) called "*Gaudete and Exsultate*" (Rejoice and Be Glad) on the Call to Holiness. First, the title intrigued me, because those words are the beginning to the refrain to the popular David Haas song "*Blest Are They*," which reminds us of the holiness that is ours when we cherish the Kingdom of God.

In Chapter Four (Signs of Holiness in Today's World), Pope Francis noted five great expressions of love for God and neighbor that he considers vital as we face worldly challenges. They so reminded me of how the MOP brothers return to their daily demanding tasks with so much love, patience, and joy:

1. Perseverance, patience, and meekness;
2. Joy and a sense of humor;
3. Boldness and passion;
4. In community;
5. In constant prayer.

After an affirming visit by Saint Teresa of Calcutta to the Kingston slums in the mid-1980s, Fr. Richard Ho Lung, the founder of the MOP, instilled one of her favorite sayings on his community: "*We can do no great things for God--only small things with great love.*" Thirty years later, this attitude completely aligns with Pope Francis' message about the importance of **communities** cherishing the **little** details of life, reminding us that "*Jesus asked His disciples to pay attention to details*" (144):

- Wine was running out at a party;
- One sheep was missing;
- Noticing the widow who offered her two small coins;
- Having spare oil for the lamps, should the bridegroom delay;
- Asking the disciples how many loaves of bread they had;
- Having a fire burning and a fish cooking as he waited for the disciples at daybreak.

Our parish is God's family--at worship and in service. How timely it is for the Holy Father to remind us of what the Holy Spirit does for God's family!

"Always ask the Spirit what Jesus expects from you at every moment of your life and in every decision you must make, so as to discern its place in the mission you have received. Allow the Spirit to forge in you the personal mystery that can reflect Jesus Christ in today's world."

We can respond to Christ's call to holiness by being present to the details that expect only our small acts with great love. This is quite possible if God's children remember, with awe and wonder:

"See what love the Father has bestowed on us!"
