### The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

### Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

### Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

### The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

**Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date.** At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

**FEDERAL DONOR RECORDKEEPING RULE ON CHARITABLE DEDUCTION**

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 included a section relative to charitable deductions. The rules require that people claiming charitable deduction back up those deduction claims with cancelled checks; records from banks or credit card companies; or written notices from the charity or not-for-profit institution. The burden is on the donor to maintain or obtain the required records.

The parish will provide a record of contributions, upon request, which will satisfy the IRS requirements. Contributions of cash can only be used as a deduction if church envelopes are used enabling the parish to identify the donor. ## BIBLE STUDY

Our evening Bible Study facilitated by John Madden, M.A. in Theology and Ministry, will be combining scripture study and reflections on the Sunday readings during Lent.

Over the course of five sessions, we'll explore the sweeping saga of God's people and their sacred journey in a *Panorama of the Old Testament* by surveying a variety of books found in the Hebrew Scriptures. ### “Is walking in holiness logical?”

I remember years ago walking into a college Math course with fear and trepidation as a returning adult student. The first day of the course the professor said to us, “For the rest of your lives, whenever you encounter a problem in life, reduce it to Math and you’ll find the solution.” I remember smiling at the thoughts of applying Math to every decision but much to my surprise, throughout my lifetime this professor’s wisdom has come to my mind over and over again in solving problems.

As we go through life we have a choice everyday especially as followers of Jesus Christ. We can choose to think in scarcity or abundance. If we see the world as having only enough resources to take care of a very limited number of people, then we will think in scarcity and think always to limit what we share. If we think in abundance, or perhaps we should say, trust in abundance, then our sharing of ourselves, our time and our treasure is done with great generosity.

Today’s readings speak to us about living “holy” lives. When we first encounter this world and think about applying the word “holy” to our own lives, you may feel that same “fear and trepidation” I mentioned related to my Math course. Perhaps Holiness can be seen through the same eyes. Growing in holiness is a lifetime event. In the second reading St. Paul helps us by reminding us that our very body is “the temple of God, and that the Spirit of

God dwells in you?” He then reminds us to take care of our bodies. Our Gospel brings us to the great challenge of holiness which defies logic – or does it?

In our Gospel we read, “You have heard that it was said, you shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father...”

Growing in holiness is about connecting with our Lord in prayer and finding Him in His people. Growing in holiness is spending time with God in our everyday world. Recognizing those who are different than us, who at times have differing opinions, who may even value things we do not --- and choosing our first step – Love!

Our first step of love allows us to give others an opportunity to explain, a moment for us to understand and at times even gift another person with acceptance. For us all to take this first step in holiness we will have to prayerfully invite an attitude of abundance into our lives. When we think in abundance, we come to depend on Our Lord as we share ourselves and our treasure. As we grow in holiness and when making decisions let us think of the abundance of God’s love and let us all allow His love to abundantly lead our thoughts. The math of God generously bestows upon our lives relationships that bless us every day – unending “coincidences” or “winks from heaven, and a constant Companion so that life can be lived without fear.”
