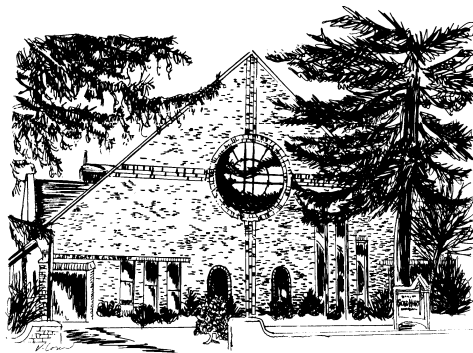

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

Funerals

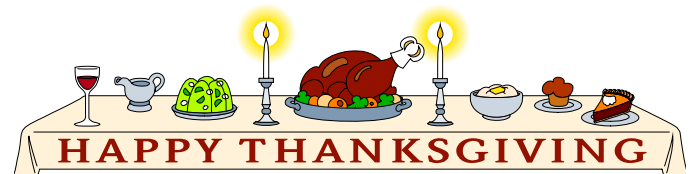

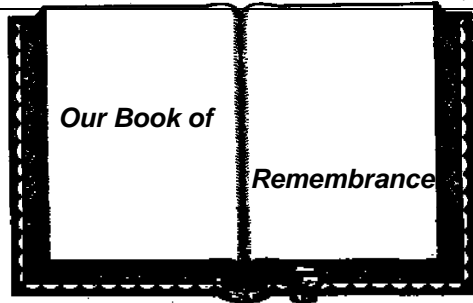

At Risk Persons Registration Program

The Mount Holly Police Department is beginning an initiative to identify and register those people in the community who may be suffering from a diminished capacity causing them to become disoriented and confused.

By initiating this program we would encourage family members to register an at-risk person at the police department. During the registration process we will gather from you the at-risk persons information, a photograph of this person, and the emergency contact information for them. This information will be kept at the police department and it will only be used when needed to identify and locate the at risk person. The information will also be placed into a local law enforcement data base that can be accessed by any agency within this county. This will allow other agencies to assist in locating the care takers of any at risk person that are lost.

This program is being made available to any family that has a member with any disability that would put them as an at-risk person for wandering away from their home regardless of their age.

We look forward to servicing the community with this program and look forward to speaking with anyone who needs assistance.

Living the Good News Today

*“Let us not sleep as the rest do,
but let us stay alert and sober.”*

In the *Liturgy of the Hours*, there is a familiar antiphon that is part of Night Prayer (Compline) every evening. It precedes the Cantic of Simeon: *“Protect us, Lord, as we stay awake; watch over us as we sleep: that awake, we might keep watch with Christ, and asleep, rest in His peace.”* How well that antiphon captures the important message that St. Paul conveyed to the Thessalonians! He told them: *“Let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober.”* In our waking and our sleeping, Christians are meant to stay focused on Christ.

In April, my husband Jeff and I spent two weeks in Kingston, Jamaica, on a mission trip. With permission from the doctor who led our team, I took a one-day break from our daily work with the Missionaries of the Poor and accompanied a lay Franciscan missionary to the Catholic elementary school where she tutored young children in mathematics.

When we left the Franciscan convent where we were all staying, we were delighted to accept a ride to the inner city from a young Jamaican couple whose teenaged daughter attended Immaculate Conception High School on the convent grounds. Although the husband and wife both worked, they struggled to make a decent living for their family. There was only one car for the entire family. The carpooling required an early start (6:00 AM) for these three family members. As we took many shortcuts to avoid the snarling Kingston rush hour traffic, I listened intently to the caring conversation between the husband and wife as they discussed what the day would be like before the family was reunited again. The wife was a teacher’s aide at the same school where the lay missionary tutored.

Staying alert and sober to what is taking place around us can make us very aware of many things: bountiful blessings; dangers and hazards to our well-being; awesome beauty that awaits our notice; random acts of kindness; unused talents that people affirm is us so that we put them in God’s service; and people who are in need and await a genuine encounter with us.

While I spent the day at the school with Janice and Cilla, all of my senses were challenged by what I witnessed. The school had guards at all of the entry points due to the dangers of the inner city. Hundreds of children were in constant movement, proudly wearing their school uniforms; and delicious smells came from the outdoor kitchen of the simple foods that would be shared with these poor children throughout the day. Because there was no air conditioning and multiple classes occupied the same crowded rooms, there were also the loud sounds of

learning all around the courtyard. My favorite memory of that day, though, was watching the gym teacher outdoors coaching the young boys and girls in track skills. I couldn’t help but wonder if the next Jamaican Olympian, another Usain Bolt, was in their midst!

This weekend, the Church observes the first World Day of the Poor, initiated by Pope Francis as the Jubilee Year of Mercy came to an end with the vision that *“Christian communities can become an even greater sign of Christ’s charity for the least and those most in need.”* Whether in Jamaica, Haiti, Central or South America, Africa, or many places right here in the US, the poor cry out for our assistance. Jesus made it clear in this weekend’s Gospel that we have been given many talents (not just money) to invest wisely in this world for the common good.

In his Message for the World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis called us to love by our deeds, challenging us to move beyond our comfort zones:

“We are called, then, to draw near to the poor, to encounter them, to meet their gaze, to embrace them, and to let them feel the warmth of love that breaks through their solitude. Their outstretched hand is also an invitation to step out of our certainties and comforts, and to acknowledge the value of poverty in itself.”

While we were in Jamaica, we learned that Cilla and her family had a relative who lived in Lindenwold. As we shared with her how close that was to us, we let her know that she was always welcome to call us if she ever came to visit so that we might have a reunion. What a blessing, then, when we received a call in August that she and her daughter had come for a visit, and we were able to pick her up and spend the day with her! As one would expect, she was overwhelmed by how much was available to Americans: convenience and grocery stores, clothing, entertainment, etc. I was so pleased to hear her say that her favorite take-away from her visit was a trip to Lancaster to visit the Sight and Sound Theater for a Christian musical, which she said reminded her of Fr. Ho Lung’s music ministry for the poor of Jamaica.

This weekend, let us stay alert and sober to the realities of our world and where Christ is present—in us and in others. Have we been generously using the talents that God has given us? Are we ready to create moments of encounter and friendship, solidarity and concrete assistance with the poor? If we remember that whether we are awake or asleep that Christ is always with us, then our deeds will find God’s favor:

“Come, share Your Master’s joy.”
