Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

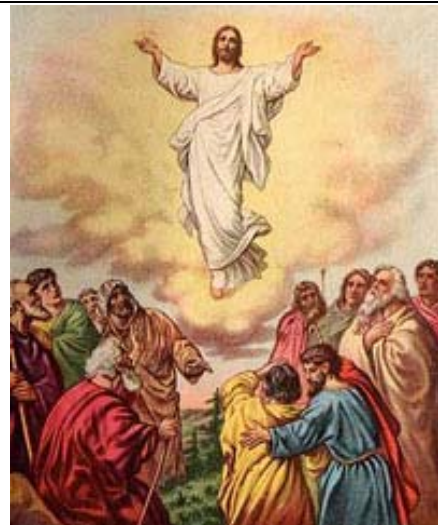

Living the Good News Today
"Love one another."

Like other Catholic households, we receive many publications from various religious orders, organizations, and service agencies that provide newsletters on what their ministries are doing and make appeals for financial assistance to support their good works. It is inspiring reading.

In a recent newsletter from Catholic Relief Services (CRS), the featured story was its celebration of the 75th anniversary of CRS in action, noting that the CRS website (<http://www.crs.org>) would share something from its history that month, as well as current world issues being supported. As I read through the newsletter after returning from our mission trip to Kingston, Jamaica, I was reminded of the global footprint of CRS and the fruit that remains wherever this charitable organization has made investments of time, talent, and treasure.

On the Third Sunday of Easter, it was my turn to facilitate a class on Catholic Social Teaching to the six adults who had been fully initiated into the Church at the recent Easter Vigil. How wonderful to journey with them in this phase of *mystagogia* and to discern *"How have I encountered God today"*? Like the newly initiated, this is also our daily call from Christ—to find Him in one another and to love. Indeed, it is Christ's commandment to us.

Catholic Social Teaching has seven themes:

1. The life and dignity of the human person;
2. The call to family, community, and participation;
3. Rights and responsibilities;
4. Option for the poor and vulnerable;
5. The dignity of work and the rights of workers;
6. Solidarity;
7. The care for God's Creation.

Holding together all seven themes, though, is an understanding of the love of God, because only love can bring the seven themes into a visible reality.

In this weekend's Scripture readings, St. John writes to the Church in both the epistle (second reading) and the Gospel. After spending intimate time with Jesus, St. John preserves an important message forever for the Church: God is love; Christ reveals the Father's love; and we are to *"love one another."* Just imagine the endless possibilities in the world if every Christian took this seriously and prayerfully focused each day on loving God in every encounter of the day!

During the CRS 75th anniversary year, the website has featured a monthly theme and stories under *Quick Links (75th Anniversary)*. Each month's theme carries the title *"A Time to or for..."*:

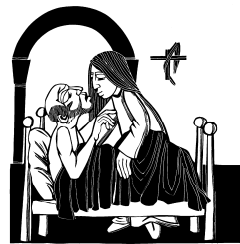
- Celebrate (January);
- Love (February);
- Joy (March);
- Blessings (April);

- Caring (May);
- Work (June).

More themes are to come as this anniversary unfolds.

In the *Time for Blessings* (April), CRS celebrated its radical venture into the relief efforts for AIDS throughout the world. For almost 15 of its 75 years, CRS has been part of a team that ministered to 700,000 people in the world affected by AIDS, as well as providing anti-retroviral treatment for 400,000. During the pandemic in Africa, CRS made a difference in addressing the vulnerability of orphaned and at-risk children,

In May 2003, President George W. Bush signed into legislation the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR). At the time, AIDS was taking a deadly toll across developing nations, especially in Africa. From its inception, CRS became part of the leadership team to implement the government funding that made a difference in 10 African countries.



Unlike some of their secular partners, CRS held fast to Catholic social teaching about the dignity of every human life, focusing their building efforts through faith-based health networks that became critical to dispelling myths and stigmas associated with HIV and AIDS. In the face of anxiety and desperation, CRS sustained an emphasis on behavior change. Today, they reflect on all of this as a blessing in time!

Just as the Gospel calls us to an extraordinary participation in family and community life, based on the value of all human life, it also requires us to look to Christ for the meaning of **solidarity**. The *Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church* tells us:

"The unsurpassed apex of the perspective indicated here [solidarity] is the life of Jesus of Nazareth, the New Man, who is one with humanity even to the point of 'death on a cross' (Phil 2:8). In Him it is always possible to recognize the living sign of that measureless and transcendent love of God-with-us, who takes on the infirmities of His people, walks with them, saves them and makes them one. In Him and thanks to Him, life in society, too, despite all its contradictions and ambiguities, can be rediscovered as a place of life and hope, in that it is a sign of grace that is continuously offered to all and because it is an invitation to ever higher and more involved forms of sharing." (196)

As the Gospel comes to a conclusion, Jesus tells His followers not only that He has chosen us, but also that He has **appointed** us to an important task with the commandment to love. We can learn greatly from CRS how we can work together with fidelity and integrity:

"Go and bear fruit that will remain."
